A BRIEF HISTORY

Tradition claims that a Saxon Church existed on the site of the present Church.

Dene (the original spelling which means 'valley') is mentioned in the Domesday Book and there is documentary evidence of a Church on this site in later Norman times as the Chapel of Saynte Mariden.

The present Deane Church is recorded as having been erected in 1452 although it appears to have developed gradually from a small 14th Century Chapel.

Continuous additions and alterations have taken place in the intervening 500 years to the present day. Most notably the 16th Century saw many changes including the rebuilding of the Nave and Clerestory and a new oak panelled roof and extensions to the aisles.

In 1522 the original name of Saynte Mariden was dropped in favour of Deane Church.

Henry VIIIth assumed the title of 'Supreme Head on Earth of the Church of England' in 1535 and in 1541 he ordained, by letters patent, that Deane become the Parish Church of ten townships assigned to it.

George Marsh was born in Deane in 1515, was a Curate in London and because of his preaching in Deane, Eccles and elsewhere was martyred near Chester in 1555.

It was not until the 18th Century that further significant changes took place when galleries were added to the West and part South Walls.

The Vestry was added in 1822 and galleries were erected along the whole of the North and South Aisles in 1833 increasing the accommodation to 1229 seats.

The next major changes took place in 1884 when the galleries were removed, the Chancel extended by 10 feet, a new Oak roof provided which is an exact copy of the original, the organ relocated and extensive re-ordering of the interior.

Significant work has taken place during the 20th Century including alterations within the tower, re-casting of the Church Bells, a complete re-build of the organ, creation of the new chapel and finally the current restoration work and internal re-ordering.

A GUIDE TO THE FLORAL DISPLAYS

LYCH GATE

The present Lych Gate was erected in 1903 to the memory of Thomas Withnell, Vicar from 1767 to 1776 by Ellen Lowe Ashton, a descendant. This area has been decorated and sponsored by Barlows Garden centre.

GEORGE MARSH CROSS

This memorial was erected by the Vicar, the Rev. H.S. Patterson in 1893. The stone on which it stands is reputed to have been the base of an ancient Saxon Cross and was moved from New York, Junction Road to the Churchyard by Parishioners.

On entering the Church the decoration along the back has been sponsored by Shaw & Son, Funeral Directors.

DOOMSDAY BOOK (1)

King William, after he had defeated the English at the Battle of Hastings, ordered his great survey of the country to be undertaken between 1080 and 1086, so this year is the 900th anniversary of its compilation. All the Lancashire Estates were recorded to be in the possession of the Crown. Dene is mentioned in the Doomsday Book and so this is an ecclesiastical site of great antiquity. This display is sponsored by the Post Office.

HENRY VIIIth AND THE DISSOLUTION OF THE MONASTERIES (2)

In 1535 King Henry dissolved the Monasteries. Abbott Paslew of Whalley Abbey tried to oppose this but was unsuccessful and was hanged in 1537. The Abbey was then seized by the King along with its possessions which included the Chapel of SAYNTE MARIDEN - the former name of St. Mary's Deane. This display has been sponsored by Warburtons Bakery Ltd., and Bentley & Co., Chartered Accountants.

In 1541 King Henry VIIIth by Letters patent ordained that the Chapel of Saynte Mariden be the PARISH CHURCH of the PAROCHIAL DISTRICT of ten townships assigned to it under ECCLES, for time immemorial, the Parish receiving the name DEANE after the ancient village.

This document, complete with seal, is displayed nearby.

TODAY'S CHURCH (3)

This display incorporates some of our present organisations: Cubs, Brownies, Scouts and Guides, Christian Youth Groups, Mothers Union and our Missionary Links through the South American Missionary Society, Bible Churchmen's Missionary Society and Tear Fund. These arrangements have been sponsored by the Organisations themselves.

JOHN WESLEY (4)

John Wesley travelled the country far and wide preaching and declaring The World is my Parish'. He came to Bolton in 1748 and preached at the Market Cross. Methodism was born in song. Charles Wesley wrote the first hymns of the Evangelical Revival in 1738. The home of Samuel and Susannah Wesley, and the birth-place of John and Charles was the Rectory at Epworth, which was destroyed by fire in 1709, and from which John was rescued. This display has been sponsored by Manor, Kay & Foley, Photographers.

GEORGE MARSH - MARTYR (5)

George Marsh was born c1515, the second son of George Marsh, farmer and woodstapler of Deane. He was educated at a local grammar school, then took up farming, married and raised several children.

After the death of his wife he went to study at Cambridge and in due course was ordained to the priesthood. He followed the reformed doctrine and because of this was arrested c1554. Condemned for heresy he was burnt near Chester on April 24th, 1555 . . . "His sufferings augmented by a barrel of pitch placed over his head".

JOHN KYNASTON-CROSS AND THE COTTON INDUSTRY (6)

The Industrial Revolution, concentrating cotton spinning in large mills brought about a large increase in the population of the Parish.


John Kynaston-Cross, whose life is commemorated by the window, owned cotton-spinning and weaving mills at Rose Hill and Moses Gate, later Crosses & Winkworth. He was M.P. for Bolton and Under Secretary of State for India between 1882 and 1885.

WHITE MONKS OF WHALLEY ABBEY (7)

They were the Cistercian Order of Monks - keeping sheep with the help of Lay Brothers. They were an austere and frugal order combating the luxury and wealth they felt had corrupted the monastic life. They used iron candlesticks, wooden crosses, plain linen vestments and natural woollen habits. It was the Monks from Whalley who are said to have come over to Deane to take services when necessary. The upper storey of the Church Tower was sometimes used as a dwelling place by the priest.

THE HULTON FAMILY (8)

The Hulton's have lived at Hulton Park since Norman times. The family was the first in the area to own a 'horseless carriage' - a motor car. In Victorian times the staff at Hulton Park attended Deane Church, half of them rode there in a wagonette and walked back, whilst those who walked to church rode back.

The Funeral Hatchments displayed on the South wall were painted in memory of Ancestors of the present Baronet.

REV. H.S. PATTERSON (9)

Rev. H.S. Patterson held the living of Deane from 1877 to 1912. Previous to coming to Bolton he had spent 3 years as a Misionary in India.

He was a colourful character who was responsible for many structural alterations to the Church. In addition to preaching the Gospel, he was also a Herbalist or Amateur Apothecary. He is reputed to have leaned over the pulpit in mid-sermon and advised members of the congregation with persistent coughs to "go to Blain's Chemists and get a bottle of my No. 4 Mixture". Some of his prescriptions are still dispensed today by Harts Chemists in Bolton.
