

#### **Television Broadcasts**

It came as a complete surprise to me to be contacted by Anglia Television for permission to broadcast two of their Lent services from Deane Church. I hadn't realized that this company is solely responsible for producing the whole series of Sunday morning services for all the ITV network. Each year these services are televised from all corners of the U.K. and then transmitted to an audience of up to a million people in all parts of the country. Because we have been invited to stand in at short notice for another Church I consulted our organist and churchwardens who were unanimous in agreeing that we should proceed even though the time was short.

The first service will be broadcast live on Sunday February 16th at 10.45 am and it will last 55 minutes and 40 seconds precisely! The congregation is required to be in place by 9.45 am at the latest. The producer wants the broadcast to be very similar to our normal Family Communion though, of course, we will be conscious of the presence of lights, microphones, cameras and television crew members. However, they are most anxious to intrude as little as possible so that we are able to worship and invite the viewers also to worship with us.

The second service will be recorded the same afternoon from 2.00 to 4.30 pm to be broadcast on Sunday March 9th. As this will be Mothering Sunday this service will be a Family Service with a distinctly Mothering Sunday flavour about it. For this second service the producer has asked me to extend an invitation to the other Christian Churches in this area to join with us and this I am very happy to do.

The preacher on both occasions will be the Rev'd Dr. Colin Morris, a Boltonian who was President of the Methodist Conference several years ago. He is a regular broadcaster and will be preaching a series of seven sermons with the title "Back to Basics". I have invited a number of our Church family to take a leading role in the two broadcasts as readers, singers in the choir and music group, musicians and leaders of the intercessions. For these people this will involve a considerable amount of rehearsal time. I commend them and indeed the two services to your prayers.

As a consequence of these arrangements the Sunday School Departments will not meet separately on that Sunday morning. Instead I wish to encourage parents to come with their children and sit together as families either in the morning or more especially in the afternoon. There will be no evening service at Deane that day.

#### **Lent Reading**

For the last few weeks in my Quiet Time I have been reading David Winter's day-by-day reflections on the words of Handel's Messiah. David Winter was a schoolteacher who eventually became Head of Religious Broadcasting at the BBC, after which he was ordained. He is an extremely good communicator who has that ability to take familiar words and phrases which we use but do not really understand, and make them so much clearer and meaningful. I have found these reflections most helpful as I found his "What's in a Word" very enlightening in the 40 days of Lent last year. I can warmly commend one or other of those books to you for your own use this Lent. They are obtainable from the Wesley Owen bookshop on Deansgate or can be ordered through our Church bookstall at £5.99 each. I am planning to read his "40 Days with the Messiah" again but this time accompanied by a cassette of selections from the Messiah sung by members of the world famous choir of St. Margaret's Westminster. I am looking forward to this because the music can greatly enhance our understanding of the words. The book and cassette are available separately or together in a pack.
